2017 Bay State Games – Junior - 3P Small-bore Rifle Match

Date: Saturday September 10, 2017

Location: Reading Rifle and Revolver Club, Outside 100 Yard Range

Directions: Take I-93 North

At I-93 Exit 37A, turn off onto ramp

Merge onto I-95 North/RT-128 N towards PEABODY

At I-95 exit number 40- towards WAKEFIELD CTR./N. READING turn off onto ramp

Coming off the ramp go around the rotary and go back under 128 and stay in the right lane

Haverhill St is the first street on the right, you will see the National Guard Base on the right side at the beginning of the street

Continue up the street for about one mile. On your right you will see the sign for the Ice arena and Reading Rifle. On the left is a church.

Take a right onto the same street as the ice arena, but stay on the right side of the road and continue up the road past the ice arena. The road splits left for the arena and right for the gun club.

You will come to The Gate of the Club

Continue thru the gate, proceed along the road until you come to the main club house.

Targets – A26/6 - 50 Meter Small-bore Target

Relays: Each relay will accommodate 18 competitors.

Spots will be drawn at random on the day of the match. Competitors will not be allowed to switch locations unless approved by the match director.

Times:

Relay 1 – 8am to 10am

Relay 2 – 10:30 to 12:30pm

Relay 3 – 1pm to 4pm – If relay 1 and 2 are full, we will move on to fill relay three.

Course of Fire - Saturday September 10th – Metallic Sights

Match #1: 20 shots, prone, metallic sights, A---26/6 target, 20 min

Match #2: 20 shots, standing, metallic sights, A---26/6 target, 30 min

Match #3: 20 shots, kneeling, metallic sights, A---26/6 target, 30 min

Match #4: Bay State Games Metallic Sight Championship (non-fired – Aggregate of matches 1,2,3)

Fees: \$20.00 per shooter, payable to the Bay State Games when registering

Register at – www.baystategames.org Select – Small-bore Rifle (Please note there is two events running one for air rifle and one for small-bore. Each event is running separately, please make sure you are selecting and registering for the correct event.

Eligibility

An athlete must meet one of the following criteria:

- A full time resident of Mass, Maine, Vermont, New Hampshire, New York, Rhode Island and Connecticut.
- A full time student

Age Divisions

Junior - Age 10-14

Scholastic - Age 15-19

- All ages are as of December 31, 2017

Please select which relay you would like to reserve. Please sign up for Relay 1 or 2 first. When both relays are full they will close and the third relay will become available. Each relay will hold up to 18 competitors.

Awards

All participants receive a Bay State Summer Games T Shirt. * Make sure you fill out the appropriate size when registering.

Medals and prizes will be presented as follows: *Athletes will receive only one award

- *Gold, Silver, and Bronze Championship Medals for overall match top three athletes.
- *Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals for each age division.
- *Gold, Silver, and Bronze Medals for each participating state provided there are at least 6 athletes from each state participating. If there is not enough from a state to create a separate category, those athletes will be put in with the athletes from Massachusetts.

Rules

- NRA air rifle scoring rules will apply
- This is not a NRA registered match
- NRA membership is not required to participate

Conduct: All Competitors, Parents, Coaches and observers are to conduct themselves professionally on and off the line. Any interference in the running of the match will not be tolerated and such individuals will be asked to leave.

Competitors are asked to keep all equipment neatly organized behind them in such a way that a clear path is there for line officials. All competitor and spectators are asked to clean up after the matches are completed.

Once the competitors are called to the line, only the line officials may approach the competitor. If a coach would like to talk to a competitor they need to contact the line official and they will pull the competitor from the line.

Observers, parents and coaches are encouraged to sit and relax behind the firing line. Sun screen, bug spray, hats and lots of water is recommended.

FOOD: There will be food and water available at a cost.
